This past school year was full of challenges—in my life and the lives of our students, families and staff—and was a reflection of the greater world around us. My work with the Links program was full of adjustments. Initially, when I, like everyone, was still trying to understand the scope of the pandemic, every day I would check in

Because I called so much, I really got an opportunity to get to know our families and they got to know me as well. In early spring of 2021, I began to reinstate home visits. Of course, home visits had to be modified and consisted of meeting on the front porch, on the sidewalk, in stairwells, or parking lots. Despite the limitations, parents and students appreciated the effort.

Financial problems escalated during this time and many families found themselves facing unemployment and lacking basic needs like food. Many churches were offering food pantry items so I began to regularly utilize them and gathered groceries for families—a lifesaver for many of them. In addition, several families were facing eviction and needed real practical assistance to remain in their homes. One family in particular was threatened with eviction on a regular basis in spite of the moratorium. On three separate occasions I met and walked with the parent to the property management office to help her advocate for paperwork that she needed, and assisted her with completing a document which prevented her family from being evicted. This was a challenging process, but a learning opportunity as well. I have the unique opportunity to hear the intimate struggles and desires that our parents express about their children and themselves. The relationships that I have built with our families are mutually respectful and invaluable. A solution-focused approach is needed, as well as empathy and compassion. Many parents need a nonjudgmental, listening ear.

Though challenging on many levels, this school year proved to be one of the most rewarding. After the whirlwind of the spring semester of 2020, we set out to provide a robust and purposeful virtual learning experience for our students. We quickly modified our admissions approach to meet our prospective families' needs, including scheduling after hours and on the weekends. Our in-person interviews became video meetings and our school tours became virtual slideshows. This adaptation made us even more

accessible to families and provided the opportunity for our students to enroll and engage in the program more quickly. It was wonderful to finally see all of our students in person when we returned to the building in March 2021. An emphasis was placed on staff professional development with weekly offerings to enhance our overall skill base in a variety of special education areas. It was a pleasure to work so closely with my colleagues to develop and present a series of creative, high-quality training opportunities. We also continued our Preventative Services work with Montgomery County Public Schools, providing coaching and consultation for their Social Emotional Special Education Services programs. We provided guidance and support for inservice trainings, data analysis systems, student engagement, behavior management, and program recommendations.






# **FINANCIAL STATEMENT**



is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that is committed to transparency through annual audits and 990 reporting while providing the highest level of service to our students. The organization's primary revenue comes from tuition and related services paid by state and local jurisdictions. These funds do not cover the supplemental programs our students require to succeed in school. Community support in the form of grants and contributions from our partners and donors enables us to further our mission of preparing students to be successful contributing members of society.

Our continuing challenge has been to meet the intensive educational, clinical, and behavioral needs of our students. With 80% of our student population living in poverty, the needs are great. Outreach services such as inhome interventions and linking families to outside resources are vital to our students' success and supported primarily by grants and donations.



\*According to the BBB Wise Giving Alliance, a charity must spend 65% or more of its expenses to directly fund programs to achieve accreditation. At The Foundation Schools, 88.1% of revenue is spent on programs and direct services for our students.



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


